John Allen Harrington John Allen Harrington (January 19, 1812 – January 27, 1880) was a Republican member of the U.S. House of Representatives from Pennsylvania. John Allen Harrington was born in New Harmony, Indiana, and attended Jefferson College in Canonsburg, Pennsylvania. He moved to Lebanon County, Pennsylvania, in 1833, and to New Harmony, Indiana, in 1836. He married Mrs. Anna L. Gons, and they had five children. He was ordained in the Universalist ministry, and he served as pastor of the New Harmony Universalist Church from 1842 to 1866. Harrington was elected as a Republican to the Forty-fifth and Forty-sixth Congresses. He was not a candidate for renomination in 1872. He was appointed postmaster of New Harmony in 1873, but resigned his office in 1874. He died in New Harmony in 1880 and was buried in New Harmony Cemetery. As of Wednesday morning, President Trump has nominated three top scientists for the agency's top leadership posts, including former top Obama administration official Jane Lubchenco, a pioneering researcher on climate change. The White House is already on a timetable to confirm the nominees, the three people familiar with the matter said, so soon after Trump's inauguration it will likely be days before the posts go to Congress for review. That could add a frenetic pace to the normal, months-long vetting process. Trump named the first trio to lead three of the agency's top bureaucracies Wednesday morning, naming Lubchenco to serve as head of NOAA and head of the
